A Note from the Dean

Thy Kingdom Come

These three words, familiar to us from the Lord's Prayer, are the title of a prayer initiative that has spread around the world in just over a year. Last year, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York invited people across the Church of England to join in a wave of prayer between Ascension Day and Pentecost. You may remember that we at Ripon Cathedral did exactly that, along with hundreds of thousands of others in a number of different denominations. Our response included prayer stations and several prayer workshops that proved popular.

The Archbishops were inspired by the risen Christ's charge to his disciples after his resurrection according St. Luke in the Acts of the Apostles. Acts 1:6ff reads, "So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Famously, the disciples went into Jerusalem and waited for the gift of the Holy Spirit; it arrived in a dramatic way on the Day of Pentecost, enabling people of different languages to understand each other and resulting in about three thousand people being baptized in response to St. Peter's preaching. Now, that would be good to see in and around Ripon Cathedral!

The disciples had asked about the kingdom and Jesus promised them the gift of the Holy Spirit and power to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth. The Archbishops therefore asked for members of the Church to pray for more people to be brought into the community of faith, to become disciples of Jesus Christ who will then live in a way that helps the world to be rather more like God's kingdom than otherwise it would be. Well, *Thy Kingdom Come* has grown in a way that might suggest to us that the Holy Spirit is at work.

This year, the three Cathedrals in the Diocese of Leeds are joining forces to give a lead with *Thy Kingdom Come* in this region. Many parish churches will also be taking part in many different creative ways. The Cathedrals are hosting three main services, one each, starting with Bradford on the evening of Ascension Day, Thursday 25th May; followed by Ripon on the Sunday after Ascension, 28th May, at 3.30pm with a Seasonal Songs of Praise and Bishop Toby as preacher; and then ending at Wakefield at Pentecost, 4th June. Also, here at Ripon, there will be prayer stations in the Cathedral for the full ten days, enabling an even larger number of people to join in these world-wide prayers for the growth of Christ's Church and kingdom.

Please, do join us for the service and participate in your own personal daily prayers. As Archbishop Justin has said, "In praying 'Thy Kingdom Come' we all commit to playing our part in the renewal of the nations and the transformation of communities."

Christian Aid Week (14th -20th May)

One way in which countless Christians and others help to further God's kingdom in the world is by supporting the work of Christian Aid. This remarkable charity was founded by British churches in 1945 to support refugees who had lost their homes and possessions in the Second World War. For over sixty years, it has been responding to human need in many of the most testing circumstances and locations around the world. Now a significant relief and development organization, it is supported by 41 different Churches in the UK and Ireland. A central ambition of Christian Aid has been to enable people to support themselves - a good way of showing God's love in practical ways that make a lasting difference.

Christian Aid Week is a time when tens of thousands of people across the UK and Ireland pray and raise funds for Christian Aid's work around the world. Amongst some of its most inspiring efforts are still initiatives to help refugees. The local Ripon Christian Aid support group has a good record of organizing the annual house-to-house collection and raising the profile of Christian Aid. Please, do support them with prayer and offer to help in practical ways, if you can. Details are available on the Cathedral Website or at the parish information table in the South Transept of the Cathedral.

<u>The first St. Wilfrid Conversation: Why Bother with Yorkshire?</u>

You may be aware that we have been planning to replace the former St Wilfrid Lecture series with a new way of engaging people in theological reflection on the issues and challenges of the day. This is the St Wilfrid Conversations in which two or three people who are experts in particular subjects will explore particular issues and questions. There will always be a theological dimension to these but they will be done in a way that will enable all of us to engage and take part in the ongoing conversation. We had planned for the first St Wilfrid Conversation to take place on Saturday 13th May and to be entitled *Why Bother with Yorkshire?* I have been pleased with the amount of interest that this has already started to generate. It is inevitable however that with this subject, not least when it is bound to prompt questions about regionalism and devolution that this may trespass onto political debate that would be inappropriate in the run up to a General Election. Having consulted with Bishop Nick and Sir Gary, I have decided to postpone this event until after the Election. If at all possible, we will arrange a Hustings event here at the Cathedral – please do look out for publicity about this. Also we are now working with the diaries of the Cathedral, the Bishop and Sir Gary to find another date for the St Wilfrid Conversation – again please look out for publicity.
